TONIGHT'S GAME...The San Francisco Giants host the Cincinnati Reds in the 1st game of this best-of-5 Division Series...Giants' right-hander **Matt Cain (16-5, 2.79)** will face Reds' right-hander **Johnny Cueto (19-9, 2.78)**.

THE GIANTS...have advanced to the postseason for the 5th time in the last 16 seasons and for the 10th time in San Francisco Giants history (since 1958).

NL WEST CHAMPS...The Giants won the 2012 NL West division for the 8th time since the advent of divisional play began in 1969 (1971, 1987, 1989, 1997, 2000, 2003, 2010, 2012)...it's the 2nd time in the last 3 seasons that they've won the NL West.

CLINCHED...The Giants clinched the NL West on Sept. 22 against the San Diego Padres...they did so in game number 152, tied for the 2nd-fewest games played to do so in SF-era history.

POSTSEASON HISTORY...The Giants franchise owns 6 World Championships (1905, 1921, 1922, 1933, 1954, 2010), 21 Pennants and this is the 24 playoff appearance in the teams history...overall, the Giants have gone 73-77-2 (win-loss-tied) in the postseason since 1900 (8-12 in League Division Series, 16-11 in League Championship Series and 49-54-2 in World Series).

POSTSEASON - SF-ERA...This is the 10th playoff appearance for the Giants since moving to San Francisco in 1958 (1962, 1971, 1987, 1989, 1997, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2010, 2012)...SF owns one World Championship (2010) and 4 Pennants (1962, 1989, 2002, 2010)...the Giants are 34-36 all-time in the postseason since 1958.

PLAYOFF OPENERS...The Giants have posted a 19-9 record in playoff series openers (4-1 in League Division Series, 4-1 in League Championship Series and 11-7 in World Series)...the Giants won each of their 3 series openers in 2010 and have won each of their last 4 Division Series openers, outscoring opponents by a 16-6 margin.

AT HOME...The Giants will open the postseason at home for the 3rd-consecutive time...the Giants are 41-34 all-time at home in the playoffs...they've gone 20-14 in San Francisco and 12-7 here at AT&T Park...SF has won 8 of their last 11 postseason home games.

AT THE HELM...Bruce Bochy, in his 6th season as the Giants skipper, has led San Francisco to its 2nd NL West crown during his tenure...this is the 4th time in the last 8 seasons that he's guided his team to the playoffs (2005, 2006 with SD and 2010, 2012 with SF).

BOCHY IN POSTSEASON...This marks the 6th time in Bochy's career he will manage in the postseason, having done so with San Diego in 1996, 1998, 2005, 2006 and with San Francisco in 2010 and now in 2012...overall, he has posted a 19-20 (.487) record in the postseason...he has advanced past the NLDS twice in his career, leading the 1998 Padres and 2010 Giants to the World Series.

BAY AREA TEAMS...The Giants and Athletics (AL West Division champs) are both in the postseason for the 1st time since 2003.

DID YOU KNOW?...Beginning with the 1994 season when the divisions were realigned and expanded to 3 (Eastern, Central, Western), the Giants have won the NL West 5 times, tied with the Dodgers and Diamondbacks for the most during that span (excludes 1994 strike season).

REMEMBER 2010?...Just 2 seasons ago the Giants won the 106th World Series vs. the Texas Rangers, 4-games-to-1...it marked the Giants' 1st World Series title since 1954 and 1st since moving to the city of San Francisco in 1958...the Giants went 11-4 throughout the 2010 postseason, also defeating Atlanta, 3-games-to-1 and Philadelphia, 4-games-to-2.

VETERAN ROSTER...Of the 25 players on the Giants' 2012 NLDS roster, just 7 players have never appeared in postseason games (career regular season games in parenthesis): **IF Joaquin Arias (225), IF Brandon Belt (208), OF Gregor Blanco (394), IF Brandon Crawford (209), RHP George Kontos (51), C Hector Sanchez (87), and RHP Ryan Vogelsong (181).**

GIANTS-REDS...The Giants and Reds are facing each other in the postseason for the 1st time...the Reds are now the 17th different opponent that the Giants will face in the postseason...the opponent that the Giants have played the most in postseason play are the New York Yankees (43 of 152 postseason games).

THE GIANTS...finished the 2012 regular season with a 94-68 record and in 1st place in the NL West, 8.0 games ahead of the 2nd-place Dodgers.

- 94 victories were the most in a season since 2002 (95).
- Finished the season 26 games over .500.
- Matched the Braves for the 3rd-best winning pct. in the NL behind Washington (.605, 98-64) and Cincinnati (.599, 97-65).

WITH THE BATS...The Giants averaged 4.43 runs per game (718 runs/162 games), the 6th-highest avg. in the NL and nearly a run more than they averaged last year (3.52, last in the NL)...SF's .269 avg. was the 3rd-highest in the league behind Colorado (.274) and St. Louis (.271).

ON THE MOUND...After ranking 1st or 2nd in the NL in ERA the past 3 seasons, the Giants' pitching staff finished 5th in 2012, fashioning a 3.68 figure...the starting staff posted a 3.73 ERA (5th in the NL) while the relief corps had a 3.56 mark (8th in NL)...SF converted 53 of 66 save chances (80.3%), the highest save pct. in the NL and the 2nd-most rescues in the league behind Cincinnati (56).

WITH THE GLOVES...The Giants committed 115 errors, the 4th-most in the NL.

AT AT&T PARK...The Giants went 48-33 (.593) at AT&T Park, tied for the 5th-best home record in the NL...the offense hit .267 (711-for-2,665) at home while averaging 3.8 runs per game (308 runs/81 games)...**SF's 31 HRs at home were the fewest they'd ever hit at AT&T Park and the 3rd-fewest home HRs in SF-era history (24 in 1980, 28 in 1981).**

ROAD WARRIORS...The Giants tied the Braves for the 3rd-best road winning pct. in the NL this season, going 46-35 (.568)...only the Nationals (.593, 48-33) and Reds (.580, 47-34) had a better road record in the NL.

HOME/ROAD RUNS...SF averaged just 3.80 runs per game (308 runs in 81 games) at AT&T Park this season, which ranked as the 6th-lowest average in the big leagues...**however, on the road, the Giants averaged 5.06 runs per game (410 runs in 81 games), the 2nd-highest figure in the Majors behind Los Angeles-AL (5.17).**

ROAD SERIES WINS...The Giants lost just one series on the road since the All-Star break, going 10-1-1 (win-lost-split) in their last 12 road sets...their only series loss came at the hand of the Dodgers in the very last series of the season (Oct. 1-3).

BEST ON THE ROAD SINCE THE BREAK...Since the All-Star break, the Giants went 26-11 (.703) on the road, the best figure in the Majors.

SOUTHPAW SUCCESS...The Giants posted a 40-19 (.678) record this season when facing opposing left-handed starting pitchers...that was the highest winning pct. in the Majors.

RISP 1ST HALF-2ND HALF...Prior to the All-Star break, SF batted .225 (174-for-773) with RISP, which ranked as the 2nd-to-last lowest figure among NL teams...**however, following the break, SF hit .296 (217x734) in these situations, the highest clip in the Majors.**

1ST INNING RUNS...The Giants scored 118 runs in the 1st inning, by far the most runs they scored in any inning this season...it was tied with the Yankees for the 2nd-most runs scored in the 1st frame behind Colorado (123 runs).

LAST IN HOMERS...The Giants are just the 7th team since 1900 to reach the postseason despite hitting the fewest HRs in the Majors...the others: see chart on right hand side.

TRIPLES ALLEY...The Giants led the Majors with 57 triples (had 24 last year) just 5 shy of matching the most in a season in SF-era history (62 in 1960)...it was the 1st time for SF to lead the bigs in 3-baggers since the 1973 team did so (52).

CENTRAL COMMAND...SF posted a 27-14 (.659) record against NL Central opponents this season, going 16-6 at home and 11-8 on the road...SF's .659 winning pct. against NL Central teams ranked as the 2nd-best in the NL behind Washington (.690, 29-13).

CLOSE CALLS...The Giants' 30 one-run victories were the 2nd-most in all of Major League Baseball behind Cincinnati (31).

#15 Bruce Bochy

6th season as Giants manager (2007-present)
18th season as a Manager in big leagues (1995-present)

- The 2012 season is Bruce Bochy's 18th season as a Major League manager and his 6th at the helm of the San Francisco Giants (2007-present).
- **In his 6 seasons as the Giants skipper he's posted a 503-469 (.517) record...the Giants have won the NL West twice during his tenure (2010, 2012).**
- Owns a postseason managerial record of 19-20 (.487).
- This marks the 6th time in Bochy's career to manage in the postseason, having done so with San Diego in 1996, 1998, 2005, 2006 and with San Francisco in 2010 and now in 2012...his 6 postseason appearances as a manager are tied for the 2nd-most among active managers (Jim Leyland has 7).
- He has advanced past the NLDS twice in his career, leading the 1998 Padres and 2010 Giants to the World Series.
- Leads active managers in consecutive years managed (18).
- Guided the 2010 Giants to their 1st-ever World Series title in San Francisco history and 1st World Championship since 1954.

POSTSEASON CAREER

- Had a stellar postseason debut in 2010, going 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0er, 21.1ip) in 3 starts.
Has not allowed an earned run in 21.1 postseason innings, the 6th-longest streak in Major League history and the 2nd-longest in Giants franchise history...

MOST CONSECUTIVE IP WITH-OUT ALLOWING ER TO BEGIN POSTSEASON CAREER

- This will be the 1st time he'll start Game 1 of a postseason series.

2012 REVIEW

- 28-year-old veteran completed his 8th season with the Giants, going 16-5 with a 2.79 ERA (68er, 219.1ip) and 2 complete games in 32 starts.
His 16 victories, 2.79 ERA and 193 strikeouts were all career-bests.
Among the NL leaders, finished 3rd in innings pitched (219.1) and in opponents avg. against (.222), 4th in ERA (2.79) and winning pct. (.762, 16-5), tied for 6th in wins and 8th in strikeouts (193).
Tossed the 22nd perfect game in Major League Baseball history on June 13 vs. Houston...it was the 1st perfect game in the 130th-season history of the Giants franchise.
His perfect game marked the 14th no-hitter in Giants franchise history and the 6th in SF-era history (since 1958).
Was 1 of 3 pitchers to have a perfect game in 2012, joining Philip Humber of the Chicago White Sox on April 21 at Seattle and Felix Hernandez of the Mariners on Aug. 15 vs. Tampa Bay...it's the 1st time in Major League history that three perfect games have been recorded in the same season.
Became the 7th pitcher in Giants franchise history to start an All-Star Game (8th time), joining Carl Hubbell (1934), Juan Marichal (1965, 1967), Vida Blue (1978), Rick Reuschel (1989), Jason Schmidt (2003) and Tim Lincecum (2009).
The Giants went 21-11 (.656) when he took the hill, going 10-5 at home and 11-6 on the road...SF won 8 of his final 10 starts.
Held right-handed hitters to a .191 avg. against (79-for-414), which was the 2nd-lowest figure in the NL behind WSH's Stephen Strasburg (.185).
Held opponents to a .171 avg. against (30-for-175) with runners in scoring position, the 3rd-lowest mark in the Majors behind WSH's Jordan Zimmermann (.163) and CWS's Chris Sale (.169).
Went 15-0 (team went 18-2) when receiving 3-or-more runs of support.
21 of his 32 starts were quality outings, the 2nd-most quality starts on SF's staff behind Ryan Vogelsong (22).
Went 8-3 with a 2.03 ERA (25er, 110.2ip) in 15 starts at AT&T Park...his 8 home wins were tied for the 9th-most in the NL, while his 2.03 ERA was the lowest home figure among all pitchers in the league...it marked the 2nd-lowest home ERA for a season in AT&T Park history behind Tim Lincecum's 1.88 figure in 2009.
Was 8-2 with a 3.56 ERA (43er, 108.2ip) in 17 starts on the road...his 8 road wins were tied for the 8th-most in the NL.
Signed a 5-year extension with a club/vesting player option for the 2018 season on April 2.

VS. CINCINNATI

- 2 of his 5 losses in 2012 came against Cincinnati as he went 0-2 with a 5.54 ERA (8er, 13.0ip) in 2 starts against them this year...overall, is 4-5 with a 3.54 ERA (27er, 68.2ip) in 10 career starts vs. the Reds.

CAREER

- Is a 3-time NL All-Star (2009, 2011, 2012).
Has crested the 30-start barrier in each of his 1st 7 full seasons...the only player with a longer current streak is Bronson Arroyo, who has 8-straight seasons of 30-or-more starts...before Cain, only two Giants pitchers started more than 30 games in 7-straight campaigns: Hall of Famers Christy Mathewson (14, 1901-1914) and Mickey Welch (8, 1883-1890).
His 55 wins since the beginning of the 2009 season are the 3rd-most in the NL behind Yovani Gallardo (60) and Clayton Kershaw (56).
Has gone 73-9 (.890) when the Giants score at least 3 runs of support for him (116 starts).
Is 1 of 3 pitchers in SF-era history (since 1958) to log at least 200.0 innings in 6-consecutive seasons, joining Gaylord Perry (6-straight from 1966-71) and Juan Marichal (10-straight from 1962-71).

POSTSEASON CAREER

- Helped the Giants to their 1st World Series title in SF-era history in 2010 by going 2-0 with a 2.18 ERA (5er, 20.2ip) with 18 strikeouts in 4 games (3 starts) in his 1st taste of postseason action.
Became youngest Giants pitcher in franchise history to win postseason game at 21 years and 71 days old when he won Game 4 of LDS vs. Atlanta.
Became the 4th-youngest starter to win a World Series game as the Giants won Game 4 at Texas with a 4-0 shutout...only one starting pitcher younger than Bumgarner ever tossed 8.0-shutout innings in a World Series game - Jim Palmer, who was 100 days younger, in Game 2 of the 1966 World Series.

2012 REVIEW

- Posted his 2nd-consecutive 200.0 inning season, going 16-11 with a 3.37 ERA (78er, 208.1ip) with 191 strikeouts in 32 starts.
His 16 victories in 2012 were a career-high and the most wins in a season by a Giants left-hander since Kirk Rueter won 16 games in 1998.

MOST WINS BY A GIANT AGE 23-OR-YOUNGER IN FRANCHISE HISTORY

- His 16 wins were tied for the 6th-most in NL and his .593 winning pct. was the 8th-highest in the league.
Became the 1st Giants pitcher to have a 16+ win season at age 23-or-younger since Hal Schumacher won 23 games for the New York Giants in 1934 at the age of 23.

Not only were his 15 losses a career-high, but he also allowed a career-high in runs (111), earned runs (107), home runs (23) and walks (90) while tossing career-lows in innings pitched (186.0) and strikeouts (190).

Led the NL in losses, runs allowed, earned runs, wild pitches (17) and ranked 2nd in walks.

Gave up a total of 66 earned runs last season...his 107 earned runs allowed were 26 more than his previous high (81 in 2010).

Tied Madison Bumgarner for the most home runs allowed on the team with 23...allowed 16 HRs on the road and 7 at home.

- Hit safely in all 5 games of the World Series vs. Texas, going 6-for-20 (.300).
- Is the youngest Giants catcher to hit a HR in a World Series game at 23 years and 219 days old.

2012 Recap

- 25-year-old had a MVP caliber season, batting .336 (178-for-530) with 78 runs scored, 39 2Bs, 24 HRs, 103 RBI while posting a .408 on-base pct., .549 slugging pct. and a .957 OPS.
- Won the NL batting title, leading the league with a .336 avg (also led Majors)...became the 1st catcher to win the NL batting title since Ernie Lombardi did so with the Boston Braves in 1942.
- Is the 3rd catcher to win the title since 1876 (see chart on right).
- Is the 1st Giant to win the batting crown since Barry Bonds in 2004 (.362) and became the 7th player in Giants franchise history to lead the league in batting average.
- The last catcher to win the batting title in either league was Joe Mauer with the Twins in 2009.
- Won the title after a recent rule change making the final sentence of Rule 10.22(a) inapplicable to Melky Cabrera, who finished one plate appearance shy of qualifying due to his suspension (the stricken sentence would have allowed Cabrera, because of the size of his lead over his nearest competitor, to win the title though finishing with fewer than the requisite 502 plate appearances).
- Among the National League leaders he finished 1st in batting average, 2nd in OBP, 4th in slugging, 6th in RBI, T6th in multi-hit games (52), T7th in total bases (291), T8th in hits, 9th in 2Bs, and 10th in BBs (69)...also tied for 1st for the most sacrifice flies (9).
- His 103 RBI were the most driven in by a Giant since Jeff Kent had 108 RBI in 2002.
- His 82 RBI as a catcher were the 2nd-most in the NL (Miguel Montero, 88) and the 2nd-most in SF-era history (Bengie Molina, 91 in 2008).
- The only players in Giants franchise history (since 1900) to drive in 100+ runs in a season with their primary position being catcher was Walker Cooper in 1947 (122 RBI) and Dick Dietz in 1970 (107).
- Joined Dick Dietz (22 HRs in 1970) and Tom Haller (26 in 1966) as the only Giants players with 20+ home runs "as a catcher" only since 1958.
- 17 of his 24 HRs this season came on the road, the highest rate for any ML player with at least 20 HRs.
